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and by 3 st sts from each border.


Continue in this manner for rows 2 through 25 of the graph to form one set of 7 sailboats. Next, work in st st with garter st borders until blanket measures 26.5" from cast-on. Then work another set of 7 sailboats, turning the graph upside down, ie, so the bottoms of the 7 boats will be closest to the edge of the blanket.

Finishing:

Work 8 more rows of st st with garter st borders. Finish with smaller needle and 10 rows of garter st.

Bind off. Weave in all ends.

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Sailboat Graph

(Right Side Facing)

• = use purl stitch on RS

If box is empty, knit on RS, purl on WS.

Separate the boats from the border, and from each other(as shown), by 3 stockinette sts.

ABBREVIATIONS:MC = main color, CC = contrasting color, K = knit, P = purl, st(s) = stitch(es), st st = stockinette st, garter st = knit all rows, RS = right side, WS = wrong side, BO = Bind off, k2tog = knit 2 sts together, P2tog = purl 2 sts together, M1=increase by making 1 st, pss0 = pass the slip stitch over, sl 1 = slip one st.
