<u>PLYMOUTH YARN</u>™

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BABY ALPACA GRANDE Peruvian Hat



Row 6: *(P1, k1); repeat from * across, end p1. Row 7: K1, p1, k1, p1, M1K, k1, M1K, p1, k1, p1, k1: 11 sts. Row 8: (P1, k1) twice, p3, (k1, p1) twice. Row 9: K1, p1, k1, p1, k1, M1P, k1, M1P, k1, p1, k1, p1, k1: 13 sts. Row 10: *(P1, k1); repeat from * across, end p1. Row 11: K1, p1, k1, p1, k1, p1, M1K, k1, M1K, p1, k1, p1, k1, p1, k1: 15 sts. Row 12: (P1, k1) 3 times, p3, (k1, p1) 3 times. Materials: 1- 100g hank of Baby Alpaca Grande color # 2564 Needles: Size 10, or those needed to achieve gauge. Finishes: ~8" tall x 18" around.

GAUGE: 14 sts = 4" in st st on size 10 needles.

CABLE (CB4): Slip the next 2 sts to a cable needle and hold in back, knit the next 2 sts, knit the 2 sts from the cable needle. M1P = Pick up the bar between the last stitch worked and the next stitch, place it on the needle and purl into the back of it to make 1 purl stitch. M1K = Pick up the bar between the last stitch worked and the next stitch, place it on the needle and knit into the back of it to make 1 knit stitch.

HAT:

Make 2 earflaps: With size 10 needles, cast on 3 sts. PURL 1 ROW.

Begin pattern: Row 1(RS): K1, M1P, k1, M1P, k1: 5 sts. Row 2: P1, k1, p1, k1, p1. Row 3: K1, p1, M1K, k1, M1K, p1, k1: 7 sts. Row 4: P1, k1, p3, k1, p1. Row 5: K1, p1, k1. M1P, k1, M1P, k1, p1, k1: 9 sts.

ABBREVIATIONS: K = knit, st(s) = stitch(es), RS = right side, WS = wrong side, YO = yarn over, k2tog = knit 2 sts together, p2tog = purl 2 sts together, st st = stockinette Stitch = knit the RS rows, purl the WS rows, dc = double crochet.

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Row 13 (RS): (K1, p1); 3 times, k3, (p1, k1) 3 times.

Row 14: Repeat row 12.

Row 15: Repeat row 13.

Row 16: Repeat row 12.

Row 17: Repeat row 13.

Row 18: Repeat row 12. Cut yarn and set aside on spare needle or holder. Make a second earflap to match.

BODY OF HAT: With WS facing, starting at center back, cast on 7 sts, pickup and purl 15 sts from 1 earflap for right earflap, cast on 17 sts for front, pick up and purl 15 sts from 1 earflap for left earflap, cast on 8 sts : 62 sts. Row 1(RS): *(K1, p1); repeat from * across row.

Repeat row 1 -- 5 more times, thus ending with a WS row (6 rows of ribbing done).

Set up cables:

Row 1(RS): *(P2, k4); repeat from * across to last 2 sts, end p2.

Row 2: *(K2, p4); repeat from * across to last 2 sts, end k2.

Row 3: *(P2, CB4); repeat from * across to last 2 sts, end p2.

Row 4: Repeat row 2.

Work rows 1-4 until 6 cable twists total have been made, end with a row 4.

DECREASES:

Dec row 1: *(P2tog, k4); repeat from * across to last 2 sts, end p2: 52 sts.

Dec row 2: K2, p4, *(k1, p4); repeat from * to last st, end k1.

Dec row 3: *(p1, slip 2 sts to cable needle, hold in back, k2 sts, k2tog from cable needle); repeat from * to last 2 sts, end p2tog: 41 sts.

Dec row 4: *(K1, p3); repeat from * to last st, end k1.

Dec row 5: *(P1, K1, k2tog); repeat from * to last st, end p1: 31 sts.

Dec row 6: P2tog across row, end p1: 16 sts.


Dec row 7: K2tog across row: 8 sts. Cut yarn, leaving a 18" tail. Thread through remaining sts, pull up tight and anchor. Sew up back seam. Make Pom- Pom, anchor at top.

Make 2 braids:

Take 5-6 yds of yarn, pull apart into 2 plies (you can keep yarn attached to ball and just pull apart as you go). Using 1 ply, and size C crochet hook, chain 32. Turn, working into the 3rd chain from hook, work 2 DC in 1st chain, work 3 DC in next chain, and every following chain. Fasten off. Attach at each end of earflap.

Make a Pom-Pom

Cut two cardboard circles 1³/₄" in diameter. Cut a center hole 1/2" diameter in each circle.

Thread yarn needle with 3 strands of yarn, each strand about 72" in length. Holding circles together, pass needle through center hole, over outside edge, through center hole again until circle is covered & hole is full. Do not pull yarn too tight. You may need to use more yarn. Using very sharp scissors, cut yarn between the edges of the two circles.

Using a 24" strand of yarn, double yarn to a 12" length. Slip yarn between cardboard circles, pull up tightly and tie firmly. Remove cardboard circles and fluff out pom-pom. Trim with scissors to round off. Push ties through top of hat, anchor on inside.

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
