
# PLYMOUTH YARN®

## BABY ALPACA GRANDE Muffler



Approximate Dimensions: 7" wide 28" circumference

#### **Materials:**

Baby Alpaca Grande: 1—100g hank EACH of 2 color, 7754 (color A) and 7762 (color B)

**Gauge:** 16 sts = 4" on US Size  $10 \frac{1}{2}$  (6.5mm)

 $in \ \underline{Slip} \ \underline{Stitch} \ \underline{Pattern} \ \underline{after} \ \underline{blocking}.$ 

Needles/Notions: US Size 10 ½ (6.5mm) straight knitting needles + a spare needle in the same size, US Size K (6.5mm) crochet hook (for provisional Cast On), couple yards of scrap yarn, tapestry needle

Using 2 colors, both sides of this easy slip stitch pattern look great. It's perfect for an infinity muffler.

### **Begin**

Use the crochet hook with scrap yarn, work a provisional CO chain of 28 sts. With A, pick up and k 28 sts along the provisional CO chain.

Slip Stitch Pattern

Row 1: With A, \*k1, slip 1 wyib; rep from \* to end.

Row 2: With A, \*k1, slip 1 wyif; rep from \* to end.

Row 3: With B, rep Row 1.

Row 4: With B, rep Row 2.

Rep these 4 rows for pattern until work measures 28". Do not BO. Place sts onto scrap yarn.

#### Finishing

Wet block the scarf, pinning the edges down to keep them flat. Let the scarf dry completely. Place the sts from the last row you worked back onto your needle. Remove the waste yarn from the provisional CO

Place the sts from the last row you worked back onto your needle. Remove the waste yarn from the provisional CO and place the live stitches onto the spare needle.

Turn either of the needles 180 degrees to create a twist in the scarf. Keeping the needles parallel, use the Kitchener Stitch to close the seam. Weave in all ends.

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
