# **MUSHISHI BIG Buttoned Cowl**



Approximate Measurements after blocking 15" wide x 33 1/2" length

### **Materials:**

Mushishi Big:

3—100g skeins, color 106 Lime/Yellow

Gauge: 12 sts = 4" over st st on US Size 10 (6mm) needle after blocking.

**Needles/Notions:** US Size 10 (6mm) straight knitting needles, 1 cable needle, 4 toggles/Buttons from Dill #420076—42mm each.

ABBREVIATIONS: beg= begin(ning), BO= bind off, C6B= sl 3 sts to cable needle and hold to back, k3, k3 from cable needle, C6F= sl 3 sts to cable needle and hold to front, k3, k3 from cable needle, CO= cast on, cont= continue, Dec= decrease, Inc= increase, k= knit, k2tog= knit two stitches together, m= make one, mm= millimeter, p= purl, p2sso= pass 2 slipped stitches over, rem= remain(ning), rep= repeat, RS= right side, Sl= slip, ssk= slip 1 st as if to knit, slip a second st as if to knit, knit them together through the back loop, sl= slip, st(s) = stitch(es), st st= stockinette st, tog = together, WS= wrong side, yo= yarn over

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**Note:** The Cable Pattern is charted.

When working the chart, work RS Rows from right to left and WS Rows from left to right.

### **Begin**

CO 44 sts. K 7 rows.

<u>Inc Row (WS):</u> K2, m1, k2, \*m1, k4; rep from \* to last 4 sts, m1, k2, m1, k2.

56 sts on needle.

Work Cable Pattern Rows 1-8 until piece measures 32 ½" from CO edge, end having worked a RS Row.


<u>Dec Row (WS):</u> K1, k2tog, k1, k2tog, \*k3, k2tog; rep from \* to last 5 sts, k1, k2tog, k2.

44 sts on needle.


K6 rows. BO all sts on next row in k.

#### **Finishing**

Block to measurements. Since the cowl doesn't have buttonholes, choose 5 buttons that will fit snuggly inbetween the sts of the fabric. Attach 4 toggles evenly along one garter stitch edge. The toggles will be able to "button" by pushing them through the yarn overs of the lace. You can button the cowl any which way you like. The options are up to you!



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
